The following 2 day itinerary will take you to some of the premier film and television locations within Southern Oxfordshire.

Day 1

10:00 AM – Arrive in Dorchester-on-Thames: Midsomer Murders Tour

1:30 PM - Lunch at The Old Post Office

Enjoy lunch at <u>The Old Post Office</u> in Wallingford. This family-friendly pub has a relaxed vibe, serving hearty British meals, and is a great place to unwind before continuing your film and TV-themed adventure.

2:30 PM – Drive to Henley-on-Thames (25 minutes)

Henley-on-Thames has been featured in numerous films, including the **James Bond** movie **"The World is Not Enough"** and scenes from **Chitty Chitty Bang Bang**.

Explore the historic riverside town where Bond's boat chase took place on the Thames.

3:00 PM – Visit the River & Rowing Museum: James Bond Connection Visit the River & Rowing Museum in Henley, where there are often exhibitions that touch on local
